said Lawrence McFarlane admitted he had started last month's strike, but said that Fred had started this one because Yorky said that Fred could read and write and talk better than him.

Lawrence had said that Yorky told him: "You boys got to get all those boys and women out of town. No more half and half. That way people going to beat you."
