

"NAMBUCCA ANSWERS CHALLENGE"

A FUND has been started at Nambucca (NSW) to build houses for the Davis aboriginal family and other aboriginals in the district.

The fund, known as the Davis-Nambucca Heads Aboriginals Assimilation Fund, has been approved by the NSW Chief Secretary, Mr Kelly.

In a letter to the editor of The Sun, the president of the fund, the Rev. A. A. Smith, Church of England minister at Macks-ville, near Nambucca, says:

"The success or failure of the appeal will be determined by the sincerity of the Australian people in facing the challenge of aborigine assimilation. We can assure your readers that this challenge is not going unanswered at Nambucca Heads."

The fund was started after 26 people signed a petition protesting against the Davis family being helped to buy a house at Newville, on Nambucca's outskirts.

Later, one of the petitioners bought the house.
