DARWIN ABORIGINAL GO ON STRIKE FOR

DARWIN, Monday. - More than 100 aborigines employed as domestics and general helps in Darwin homes and by Government departments went on strike this morning and decided to remain out until their demands have been met.

The aborigines are demanding over about 300 yards of the road-more pay, and are asking that the way and followed by several dogs superintendent of the Berrimah and a number of small children.
