## Aborigine To Be Labour Candidate

MELBOURNE, Sunday. — The Australian Labour Party today named concert baritone, Harold Blair, full-blooded aborigine, among 20 Parliamentary candidates, two of them for Commonwealth seats.

Blair is believed to be the first full-blooded aborigine to contest a seat in Parliament.

He will contest the State seat of Mentone, at present held by the Transport Minister, Mr. Meagher, who also is chairman of the Aboriginal Welfare Board.

The Mentone seat was won by Mr. Meagher last election on D.L.P. preference votes after the L.C.P. and A.L.P. each took 46 per cent of the voting.

The A.L.P. now has announced 22 Commonwealth endorsements and has 11 to select.

There are also 26 endorsements for the State Assembly to come and 17 Upper House candidates.

The Commonwealth Parliament endorsements are:

Maribyrnong: Neil Armour, 53, clerk, Strathmore, married, one daughter. Contested seat in 1961 and was narrowly defeated.

Wannon: Cyril Primmer, 39, dairyfarmer, Kirkstall, married, three children. Belfast Shire President 1958-59. Still councillor. Captain local fire brigade.
