They said there was an argument between Perkins, his friends and the hotel staff.

Police were called and the three men were ordered to leave the hotel.

Perkins's two friends left, but Perkins stayed on, police said

Perkins was bailed to appear before the Alice Springs Magistrate's Court at 10 a.m. yesterday.
