

# PRINCESS IGNORES PROTEST

**CANBERRA (AUP).** Princess Anne forged through a mob of students at the National University yesterday, blandly ignoring red stains representing the spilled blood of slaughtered aborigines.

She strode over a black cloak, meant to represent oppression of aborigines, in the University Union building.

The president of the Students' Representative Council, Mark Cluncliffe, 20, explained to Princess Anne that the demonstration was not aimed directly at her.

He offered a Vietnam moratorium badge, and said later he did not think the Princess would have accepted or worn it.

Some of the students carried placards reading: "200th anniversary of aboriginal oppression."

Students were involved in another demonstration in Brisbane yesterday.

While the American Consul to Brisbane Mr A. H. Rosen, spoke to students at Queensland University, eight other students invaded the U.S.

Consulate in Queens Street, and others painted "smash U.S. imperialism" on the Consul's car at the university.

The students who sat in at the Consul's office said they were members of the Revolutionary Socialist Student Alliance.

They said that because the Consul was "out there in the centre of the Right Wing" they were morally obliged to protest at the Consulate.

At the university meeting the Consul gave as good as he got in a verbal exchange with the students.

The two-hour meeting started as a talk on American policy in South-East Asia but through the students it ranged to every part of the world, ending with students taking the microphone to talk about student control of the university.
