Black rebels turn on heat

SYDNEY. — Black Power agitators among Sydney's aboriginals yesterday stirred police into action in a day-long series of incidents.

In a day of tension and drama in the city:

- Aboriginal leaders foreshadowed the start of "direct action" against racism in Australia.
 - The inner city Foundation for Aboriginal Affairs building in George St. was plastered with Black Power slogans and a front door was smashed by intruders.
- In a back room of the Clifton Hotel at Redfern, eight militant Black Brothers held their own press conference yesterday afternoon.

Although some are

members of the Foundation for Aboriginal Affairs, all opposed the way it was run, claiming those in power were "Uncle Toms" in "Whitey" control.

The Foundation for Aboriginal Affairs chairman, Paster David Kirk, said later the Communist Party was financing the militants.

But the aboriginal poet and general secretary of the Federal Council for the Advancement for Aborigines and Torres Strait Islanders, Mrs Faith Bandler, said the discontent was not limited to the young people, but to all aboriginals in Australia.
