

# WHITES 'EGGING ON' BLACK MILITANTS

**BRISBANE.** — White radicals were financing and manipulating militant aboriginals to their own ends, the sole aboriginal in the Federal Government Senator Bonner, said at the weekend.

He said that no more than six aboriginals in Australia were "well and truly on the Black Power bandwagon."

But other people, including radicals at Queensland University and universities in other states, were encouraging the growth of aboriginal militancy.

"As I see it, we have radical, Left-Wing, militant white people who want to take the law into their own hands, Senator Bonner said.

"First we had the Vietnam demonstrations. When these died down, along came the Springbok tour to give them another opportunity to do their

weird and wonderful thing.

"When that finished, I believe they looked around and wondered what to do next and fastened on to the aboriginal cause.

"Now these troubles have started, they will grow and grow until they reach the same point as the Moratoriums."

Senator Bonner was commenting on Friday's "March against Racism" in Sydney, which flared into violence when aboriginals and their white supporters tried to storm the Foundation for Aboriginal Affairs office.

An aboriginal rights protest march in George St., Brisbane, last month also ended in violence and

the arrest of nine demonstrators

Senator Bonner said white radicals from Queensland University stayed in the background and "egged on" aboriginals in the Brisbane march.

He said his first reaction to the Sydney violence was disgust.

"This sort of thing doesn't tie in with aboriginal thinking or attitudes," he said. "It's completely foreign to us."

The senator said aboriginals from other states were being used to "stir up trouble," in Queensland.

"We had some from the south up here at the George St. demonstration, he said.
