

Aborigines back from Red China

SYDNEY. — A group of Aborigines returned from China yesterday impressed with the "unique" reception they had enjoyed in the country.

"The concern, care and respect accorded to members of the delegation as people and as members of the Aboriginal race was un-

ique in the experience of all of us," said Mr. Charles Dixon, who led the party.

The first four of the nine member delegation invited by the Chinese Peoples Republic Association for Friendship were welcomed home at Sydney Airport.

Mr. Dixon said the many meetings the group had with the Chinese reflected a sincere concern for the Australian Aborigine.

The group visited communes all over China and spoke with members of China's 54 minority groups.

"We left China with good will and the promise of continuous support for the unrecognised rights of our people," said Mr. Dixon.

The rest of the delegation will be returning in a few days.
