

# Police free native rebels

CANBERRA. — A.C.T. police used bolt cutters to release four Aboriginal women who chained themselves to the railing of the front steps of Parliament House yesterday.

The four women were protesting in support of the Aboriginal Embassy, removed from in front of the Parliament by police last month.

The women were among several groups of protesters who gathered outside Parliament yesterday.

The groups included pensioners, people wanting the preservation of Lake Pedder, and two 50-year-old Sydney businessmen asking to be arrested for inciting young men to refuse to register for national service.

The four Aboriginal women are Mrs. Pat Eatock, secretary-treasurer of the former "Aboriginal Embassy;" Mrs. Lyn Thompson and Miss Sandra McGinnes, both of Sydney, and Mrs. Cynthia Watson, of Brisbane.
