

Demonstration sequel: 13 appear in court

The NSW president of the Builders' Labourers Federation, Robert Arthur Pringle, and 12 others appeared in Central Court of Petty Sessions yesterday on charges arising from a National Aborigines' Day demonstration last Friday.

Pringle, 30, labourer, of Blenheim Street, Waverley, charged with offensive behaviour and resisting a policeman was remanded by Mr J. Goldrick, SM, until July 31 and allowed bail of \$100.

The others were also remanded. They are:

David Thorneson, 23, labourer, Hall Street, Bondi, charged with hindering police, allowed bail of \$100.

Peter Barton, 37, labourer, Clyde Street, Guildford; unseemly words and resisting a policeman; \$200 bail.

Jim Post, 25, rigger, Bright Street, Guildford; failing to observe a direction given by a policeman; resisting a policeman and using unseemly words; \$200 bail.

Douglas Neil Rutledge, 21, student, Benjamin Road, Mt Pritchard; offensive behaviour; \$100 bail.

Madeline Rabaud, 18, student, Glebe Point Road, Glebe; assaulting a policeman; \$100 bail.

Andres Bull, 20, seaman, Old South Road, Rose Bay; failing to observe instructions by a policeman; \$100 bail.

Kay Dianne Bellear, 28, nurse, Blake Street, Kogarah; assaulting a policeman and using unseemly words; \$100 bail.

Robert Bellear, 28, student, Callaby Street, Toongabbie; resisting a policeman and offensive behaviour; \$100 bail.

Sam Mahmoud, 23, student, Shaftsbury Road, Burwood; failing to observe directions given by a policeman; \$100 bail.

Guido Vogels, 28, student, Rona Avenue, Kensington; failing to observe directions given by a policeman, resisting and assaulting a policeman; \$100 bail.

Neil Pike, 21, Leichhardt Street, Glebe; using

unseemly words; \$100 bail.

Mr Goldrick remanded these defendants until July 31.

Viliami Holahia, 21, student, Callaby Street, Toongabbie, charged with resisting an officer and offensive behaviour was remanded until July 25, with bail of \$100.
