Aboriginal mission leaves for China

SYDNEY. — Ten aboriginals have gone to Peking to seek China's help in a move to "shame" the Australian Government over its treatment of aboriginals.

The aboriginals — five men and five women left Sydney by air yesterday. They will spend a month in Peking.

All expenses are being paid by the Chinese Government.

"They will seek China's support in forming an international lobby directed at shaming Australia to alter its policy towards aboriginals," he said.
